## Context



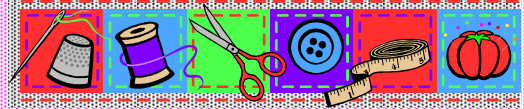
In ancient Palestine, it was customary for the groom to go to the home of the bride's parents in order to get his bride. Young girls and other guests would wait for the couple's return to the groom's parent's home before beginning the wedding banquet. Such is the scene for our parable.

The early Christian community anticipated the return of Jesus shortly after his ascension. The Gospel according to Matthew was probably written after 70 A.D., about 40 years after Jesus' death, resurrection and ascension. The early Christians by this time were eagerly awaiting his return, and may have begun to lose hope. This parable, along with others, encouraged the Matthean community to hold on, to maintain their vigilant watchfulness for the coming of Christ and not despair.

- \* What happened when the bridegroom arrived?
- \* What happened to the foolish girls? Were they allowed into the wedding party?
- \* What do you think is the point of this parable?
- \* Describe a wedding you have been to. Was it sad or happy? Why?
- \* What needs to be done to get ready for a wedding?
- \* What are things you prepare for? How do you prepare for them?
- \* What keeps us from being prepared sometimes? How can we be ready for Jesus' return? What are some things we can do everyday?
- \* Do we have a "wedding banquet" in worship? What kind of feast do we celebrate? Have you ever thought of worship as a party?
